Alterations to Lindenside were approved by ABC. Work on boundary wall and garage at Silverstones was also approved.

County Councillor's Report

Councillor Rebecca Hanson reported on the following:

Budget consultations Scrutiny Committee - health and social care Winter crisis within the NHS The County Council (CCC) budget was passed, with 4% rise in Council tax. CCC to make savings of 23%

Tree Work on the Mount

It was agreed that Robert Jackson purchase three trees to replace the tree opposite 21 The Mount. Mr Jackson agreed to replace the dead tree on The Mount, with ABC carrying out the rest of the work

Belle Vue Landscaping

Some work has been carried out by CCC, who are now in the process of confirming ownership of the remainder of the land.

Bus Shelter

Damage by vandals has been repaired by Councillor Morgan, who reports that the floor is also in need of attention.

United Utilities Tree and Legacy Fund.

The Council is grateful to Ray Day for his help with the application for funds for the village hall.

Village pub re-opens

The Belle Vue is Back!

New managers Michael and Sharron Wilkinson, a local couple with lots of experience in the hospitality trade, have already made some significant changes to the pub, not least of which is a return to the familiar name of The Belle Vue, the new signs looking particularly smart.

The Belle Vue will be open six days a week: Monday, Wednesday, Thursday, Friday & Saturday 12.00pm to 2.30pm and 5.30pm to 11.00pm, and Sunday opening will be 12.00pm till 10.30pm. Michael and Sharron plan to hold a charity quiz night on Wednesday evenings starting at 9.00pm, and they are keen to see people coming along to help raise some money for local charities.

Michael and Sharron are also particularly enthusiastic in supporting Cumbrian food producers and suppliers with Fyne Fish, Harrisons Butchers and Highgate Turkeys being some of their local suppliers; they describe their approach as offering good honest food with the pub classics and many more dishes from an extensive menu, including a number of gluten free options. Traditional Sunday lunch will be served all day on Sunday, with three roasts on offer with all the trimmings. The lunch offer during the week from 12.00pm to 2.30pm Monday to Saturday looks like it will be excellent value with a Buy One Get One Free from the specials menu.

The Belle Vue will be offering local cask ale from Jennings, a wine selection from around the world to suit most tastes and budgets along with lots of gins and a range of award wining local spirits.

The Villager wishes the team at The Belle Vue every success in their venture - a village pub needs village customers! In case you missed the flyer, the Belle Vue reopened on the 29th March.

The wrong sort of water

Readers of *The Villager* will probably have been rather perplexed at the recent activities at the Unitied Utilities site down on Robert Jackson's fields. The planned completion of laying and burying the pipes early in 2018 has taken longer than expected due, ironically, to water in the wrong place! While digging for the new pipes, United Utilities' contractors found the trenches filling up with water faster that they could dig, due primarily to the very wet winter weather, - the solution was to sink a set of parallel trenches into which pipes were installed to pump the water away, although getting away from the mud was a bit more difficult.
