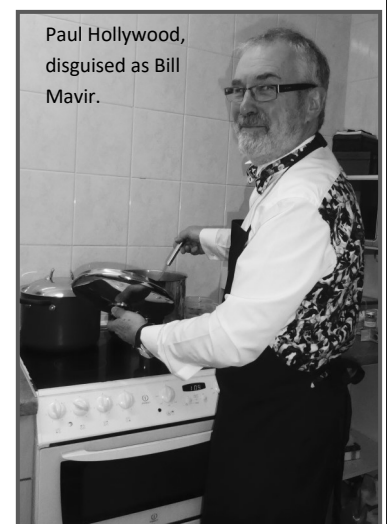

Thanks are also due to the organisers and to everyone who helped during the evening.

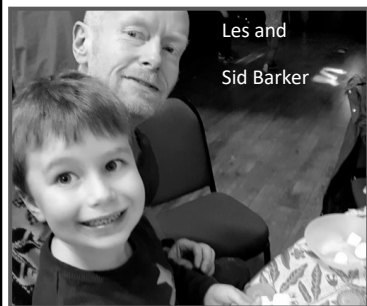
The hall is presently underused, so if anyone has any ideas for an event that allows villagers to meet and socialise, that would be great!

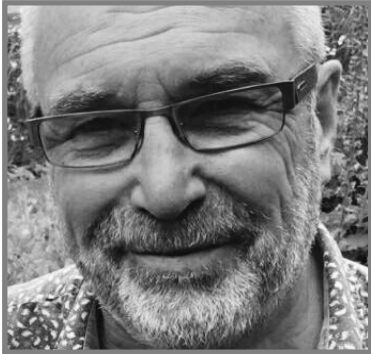
A special present from the family was an album of photographs of the children and grandchildren taken at various locations around the farm and the village. It's absolutely lovely and will be treasured for many years to come.

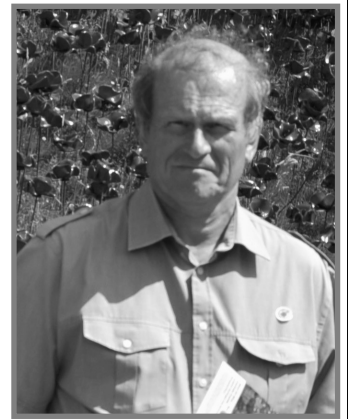


### **Gill Conlon**

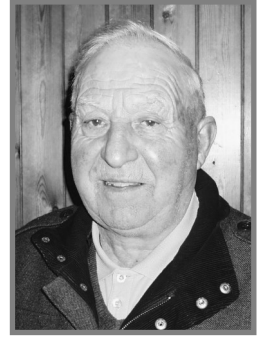
### **Carolyn Otley**

# Parish Council Snippets

Meeting held on Tuesday 8th January in the village hall.

A presentation plus video, by representatives of United Utilities, gave an overview of the pipeline project, with details of progress to date.

There was no police report, and regular police meetings for Parish Councils have been discontinued.

Cumbria County Council (CCC) has granted permission for the Parish Council to undertake landscaping work at Belle Vue. CCC has been advised that this would not set a precedent for future work.

Temporary repairs have been made to potholes on the Mount. CCC has been informed that the work is not of an acceptable standard.

CCC to be contacted regarding the inaccurate timetable in the bus shelter.

Allerdale Borough Council (ABC) has been asked to provide a larger rubbish bin at Belle Vue, where a number of cars park during the day.

The proposed transfer of the energy costs of street lighting to Town and Parish Councils, will be phased in to allow for budget provision, with energy costs from April 2020 and maintenance costs from April 2021.

Following a recent Court ruling, Parish Councils throughout Cumbria have been advised to undertake a tree liability survey on all land which the Council owns or has responsibility for. This has been organised.
