The Joy of Running

On New Year's Eve I accepted a challenge from my daughter to run every day in January. The only 'rules' were to set off from the front door, and increase the distance each Saturday by 1 km, culminating in a week of 5 km runs. Using this method, 100 km could be run over 31 days all within $\frac{1}{2}$ mile of my front door. This was my first surprise.

I used our O/S maps App on the I-Pad to plot weekly laps and loops around the village, making each week slightly different to ensure momentum and give me the motivation to keep going. However, some mornings I forgot how many times I'd run around The Mount or through the farm – was it 4 or was it 12? This didn't matter because it was fun, although it was bitterly cold at times. Knowing that the sun will rise and breakfast will be ready and tasty made the run pleasurable – the point of all my running after all.

My second surprise was the desire to keep running regularly, and it became a natural start to the day. To run early in the mornings with a torch gave me an increased sense and appreciation of the many shades of winter and the rising sun along the Derwent valley. We are blessed with such beauty.

For those who want to start running, a steady increase in distance as I've described is an effective introduction to maintaining fitness and equilibrium. These runs have inspired me to return to Saturday Park Runs, and steadily to improve my times and age percentage.

All of this has prompted me to suggest holding a 3km run around the village from the Village Hall, on a Saturday morning, for anyone and everyone to join in. Parish Council Snippets

Annual Meeting held on Tuesday 3rd May 2022 in the Village Hall.

Present: David Johnson - Chairman, Huw Morgan - Vice Chair, Councillors Robert Jackson, Jackie Day, Robert Jackson Jnr, Brian Merris, and Ian Trohear, Councillor Catherine Bell (Cumbria County Council). **Apologies for absence** were received from - John Conlon, Jill Coyle and Borough Councillors Nicky Cockburn and Janet Farebrother.

- Election of Chairman and Vice Chairman for ensuing year: David Johnson and Huw Morgan were both re-elected.
- Election of Village Hall Trustees: Robert Jackson and Jill Coyle.
- Election of Lamplugh Hall Trustee: Ian Trohear.
- Election of Cockermouth and Papcastle Recreational Trustees: Robert Jackson and Brian Merris are halfway through their term of office.
- County Councillor Catherine Bell reported on the ongoing work on the river bank. She is also pursuing potential access from the Bypass, with United Utilities.
- Two planning applications were discussed, with no objections raised.
- Bus Stop, Castle Gardens: The County Council has replaced the bus timetable at Castle Gardens with notification of the Voluntary Car Scheme. To be contacted re removal of the actual bus stop.
- Gas supplies, The Mount: This work was carried out in 2019, but a new notification has been received.
 Clerk to contact Suppliers re updating their records.
- Village Parking: Increased parking throughout the village was discussed at length, particularly the
 possible obstruction for larger emergency vehicles and decreased visibility at junctions.
- The introduction of a 20 mph speed limit was also proposed
- Sewage discharge into River Derwent: Robert Jackson Jnr reported a two day discharge to United Utilities and the problem has been resolved.
